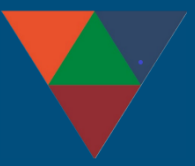

# Acknowledgement of Country



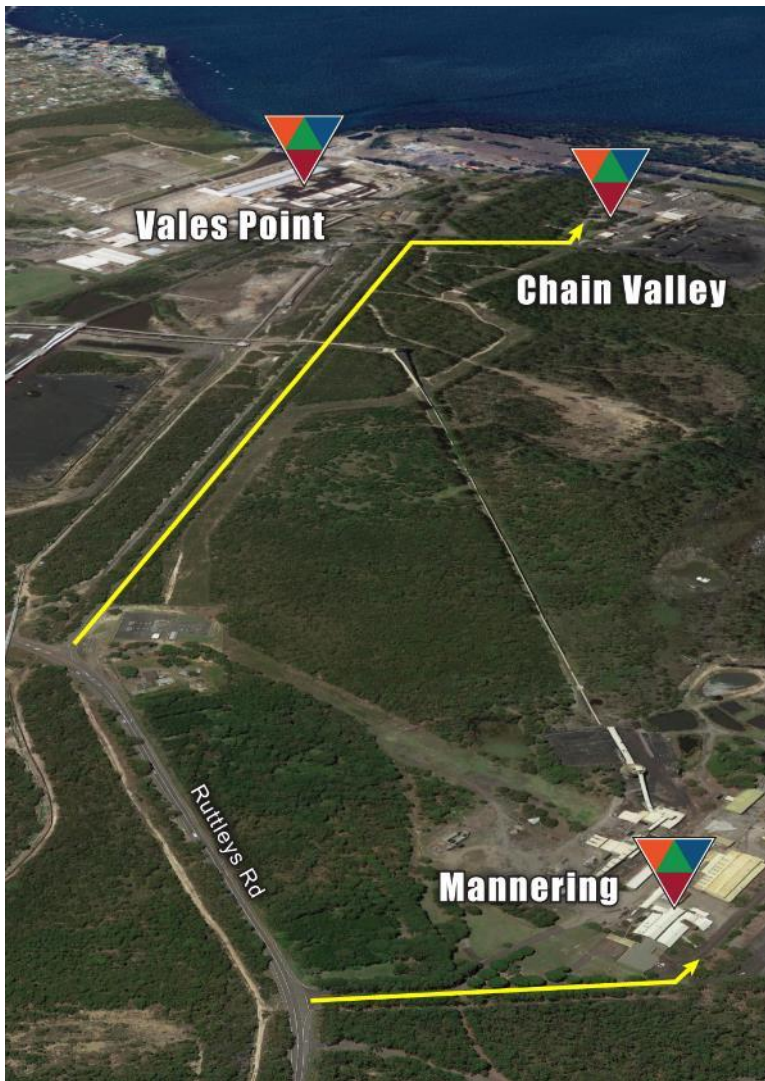

# General Information



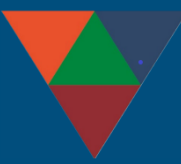

# Site log on / off



All personnel must log in and out every shift/visit.



Check in at the Security Gatehouse & complete your sign on & breathalyser.



Your Delta site contact person will meet you at the Gatehouse & escort you onsite. You **MUST** remain with your contact at all times whilst onsite.



**Only inducted personnel may perform work.** Visitor inductions do not allow a person to work.



# Fitness for access to site



Fitness for access to site (fit state) refers to the **physical**, **mental** and **emotional** state of the individual which enables them to conduct themselves in a manner which does not compromise the safety or health of themselves or others.



It is your responsibility to be in a fit state while on a Delta site.



If you feel you become unfit to remain on site at any time, then you are to inform your guide.



Delta - Blood Alcohol Concentration limit is **0.000 %**



All personnel entering site will be required to complete mandatory alcohol testing on a daily basis. There is a self tester available in the employee carpark.



Random drug testing may occur during your visit. Over the counter medications are acceptable, please inform your site contact if any of your medications may affect your safety or the safety of others.

# Prohibited Articles

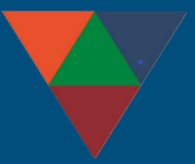


Smoking is strictly prohibited on all sites except in designated smoking areas.

## All PPE worn on site must meet the relevant Australian Standard

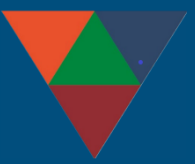


# PPE Exclusion Zones

# Fly Ash



Fly Ash is a fine grey powder and is a by-product of combustion of pulverised coal.

The fly ash at Vales Point contains a percentage of crystalline silica. If personnel are exposed to crystalline silica, there is a potential to contract respiratory diseases, for example, silicosis.

- P1 (minimum) respiratory protection is required when staff are required to work with or near fly ash.
- All personnel on site are required to carry, at a minimum, P2 respirators with them at all times when outside of buildings



# Electromagnetic Fields (EMF)



## Exposure to Electromagnetic Fields (EMF)

Some areas of our site contain equipment that emits EMF.

If you have a **pacemaker** or are **pregnant**:

**Please notify your site contact immediately** so we can ensure your safety and prevent exposure. Your wellbeing is our priority.



# Canal System Hazard Awareness



Our site canal system contains fast-flowing, aerated water, which poses a significant drowning risk if entered.

- Do not enter or attempt to cross the canal under any circumstances.
- Maintain situational awareness and keep a safe distance from the canal edges, particularly during low visibility or inclement weather.
- Warning signage and barriers are in place for your protection—please observe and respect all safety controls.

If you notice unsafe behaviour or potential hazards near the canal, report it immediately to your site contact or supervisor.



# Heights Safety



The station operates across multiple vertical levels, which may involve accessing elevated platforms, stairwells, and structures.






- If you have a concern or medical condition related to heights, please notify your site contact prior to commencing any work or site tour.
- To prevent dropped object hazards, all loose items must be secured appropriately (e.g., tools, phones, radios).
- Your site contact can provide guidance on suitable control measures, including the use of tool lanyards, storage options, or alternate access paths if required.



# Mobile Equipment & Surface Hazards



## Stay Alert – Stay Safe

-  Beware of moving machinery, forklifts, etc
-  Always maintain awareness of your surroundings
-  Obey all traffic signage and exclusion zones
-  Never assume an operator can see you – make eye contact or stay clear
-  Always keep clear of conveyor belts

# Emergency Procedures

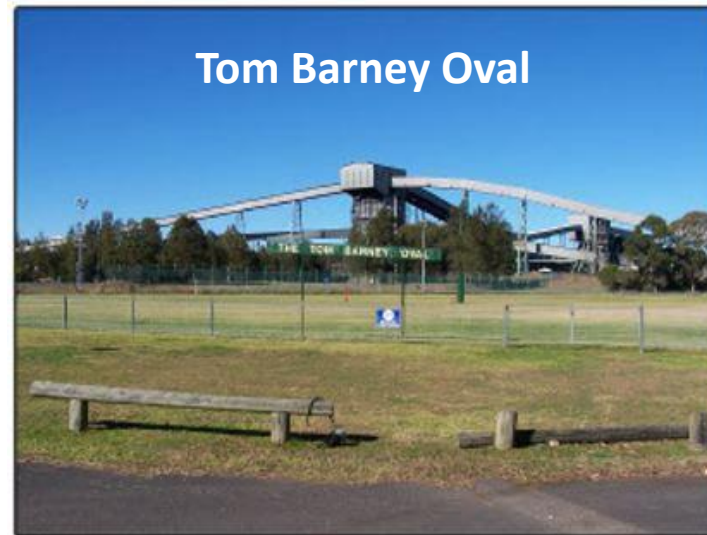
 In the event of an emergency **DO NOT LEAVE SITE! Stay with your guide.**

 Alert Siren (Intermittent Tone) – indicates there is a power station emergency

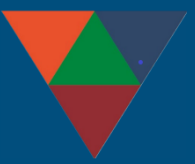
 Evacuation Siren (Wailing Tone) – indicates the need to evacuate the station

 Gather at the site muster point

 Take part in the emergency response if able



# Traffic Directions



All visitors are to park in the contractor / visitor car park as indicated by the signs *unless authorised* to park elsewhere.

If you intend to drive onsite, you will be required to provide your current drivers licence details.



Max speed limit on Vales Point Site is **20 km/h**

# Traffic Directions



## All Site Signs Must Be Obeyed

- ✓ Signs are in place for your safety and the safety of others.
- ⚠ Failure to follow signage may result in injury or disciplinary action.
- Always stop and read signs – they may indicate:
  - Hazards
  - PPE requirements
  - Access restrictions
  - Emergency information



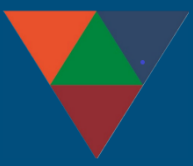
# Ash Dam - Traffic and Pedestrian Safety



- Always remain on designated roadways and pathways. Do not take shortcuts or enter restricted zones.
- Adhere to all posted signage, including speed limits, pedestrian crossings, and vehicle right-of-way instructions.
- Be aware that large vehicles operate in this area. To ensure your safety:
  - Stay visible at all times—avoid blind spots.
  - Establish positive communication (e.g., hand signals, radio contact) when approaching or interacting with heavy vehicles.

Your awareness and actions are critical to maintaining a safe work environment.

# Drains



Drains are colour coded to represent the type of material permitted in that particular drain.

- ✓ Only allow approved materials in each drain type.
- ✗ Incorrect disposal can result in contamination, environmental harm, and regulatory penalties.
- 📌 If unsure, STOP and check with your site contact before using a drain.



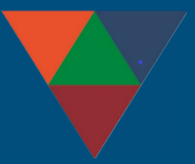
Contaminated Water

Contaminated Water

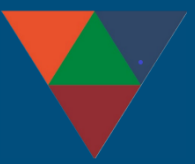


As a visitor on site, you are empowered to stop work immediately if you observe any unsafe activity that could result in harm or injury.

Everyone on site plays a role in maintaining a safe work environment—**if you see something, say something.**





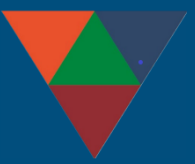
